Love Your Enemies

Where am I in loving my enemies? And why do I need to love my enemies anyway? These are only some of the many questions that haunt me. In my simple thinking it is easy to answer by just saying because Jesus is God.

As a Christian, the best test is to find myself in a situation beyond my control or in the midst of trouble. How I handle it will precisely show how deep the teaching of Jesus is in me. It is easy to be a Christian until violence is done to us, or to be the recipient of an evil deed perpetrated by those who don't appreciate our existence. The Gospel is the very picture of what this life is in reality. Yet why this teaching?

Love of enemies is based on the second greatest commandment: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt. 22:39; Mk 12:31). Our enemies have weaknesses and imperfections. Citing the Golden Rule "Do to others as you would have them do to you", is a reminder that like them, we too have weaknesses, make mistakes and are imperfect. To love our enemies does not mean we have to embrace and kiss them, but instead simply not retaliate, for God is good to everyone even to the bad. God is merciful and kind to all. 

(continued from front cover) St. Augustine reminds us that: "There is no sin committed by another which I myself am not capable of committing through my weakness; and if I have not committed it, it is because God, in His mercy, has not allowed me to and has preserved me in good."

This teaching of Jesus reminds us of our true and sublime dignity: "that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for

he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust" (Mt. 5:45). It's like the sunshine is on me even though I do not want to feel the heat and warm of it. God is love, which is the very reason of Jesus coming to the world.
