Humility is the Way to Jesus

The Koreans are fond of the following fable: "A very learned but absent minded professor saddled his donkey and went off to visit a friend. As he rode along on the donkey's back, he kept his nose in his books. The donkey soon noticed this, so the clever animal began to walk in a large circle heading right back home. On arriving, he just stood still and waited. The professor looked up thinking he was standing in front of his friend's house. He looked it over from top to bottom, and thought to himself, "Golly, my friend has let his house fall into bad disrepair. It's strange that he does nothing about it". It was his own wife who convinced him that he was looking at his own house and the criticism was true.

Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit?" (Luke 6.39) This question posed by Jesus asks where we are in our faith. Physical blindness may diminish happiness but even worse, like the professor in the story, spiritual blindness could be more damaging. It seems that our keen eyesight is for other's faults and problems only, but when it comes to our own, we are perfectly blind and it is none other than pride that blocks us.

(continued from front cover) Pride makes a proud person look down on other people thinking that he/she is the best and blessed one, while others are worthless. In spiritual life, he/she assumes the holier-than-thou attitude; believing that he's the holiest of all and assured of eternal salvation already. It's simply hypocrisy! The one who sees what is wrong with others but slow in acknowledging one's own defects and failures.

The first and second readings remind us that Jesus does not mean we have to be perfectly holy but be constantly reminded of our own sins, and failures. As followers of Jesus, we may be able to avoid this blinding pride syndrome. The reminders will drive us to hope and be assured: "But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15.57). For Jesus gives us this order to strive hard to be faithful to our original dignity as the good tree, bearing abundant good fruits. Then, we will be known as authentic follower of Jesus and children of God.

To clear our conscience, St. Augustine said: "The way to Christ is first humility, second through humility, and third through humility". This means not to stop no matter what, because Jesus did not stop in His Crucifixion but in His Ascension, so as to have eternal life!

As the season of Lent is about to begin, once again God calls us to prayer and fasting, to repentance and conversion, so as to be reunited with Him again and have another chance to be holy so as to be happy truthfully. For the only way to true and lasting happiness is by being reunited with God so as to faithfully follow God's commandment and teachings and be inspired in imitating the example laid by Jesus.
